About the Investor Alliance for Human Rights

The Investor Alliance for Human Rights (IAHR) is a diverse coalition of 138 institutional investor members, from five continents and 13 countries, with assets under management of over \$3 trillion. The IAHR provides investors with a platform to increase their leverage and capacity to press companies to respect human rights throughout their value chains and remedy adverse impacts when they occur, and to encourage governments, multi-lateral organizations and standard-setting bodies to create enabling environments for responsible business conduct.

The IAHR is an initiative of the Interfaith Center on Corporate Responsibility (ICCR). Founded 47 years ago, ICCR is a pioneer coalition of over 300 active investors representing faith-based communities, socially responsible asset managers, labor unions, and others who leverage their investments as a catalyst for social change. ICCR members work in coalition to engage the world's largest corporations on a range of social and environmental issues impacting communities in the U.S. and globally, including forced labor; climate change; food justice; sustainable water policies; health equity; and corporate influence via lobbying and political spending.

The Job

You are part of ICCR's program team focusing on the IAHR, and you will work closely with the Program Director to:

- Develop guidance, tools and strategies to support investor action on human rights;
- Participate in company engagements and dialogues;





- Coordinate/facilitate programmatic work through communication with IAHR members and coordination of meetings and roundtables with key stakeholders;
- Represent the IAHR at public forums and conferences;
- Develop strategic connections with external actors, including NGOs, academia and others;
- Engage governments, multi-lateral organizations and international finance institutions to ensure these create policies and standards that are in line with international human rights and business standards.

Qualifications

- Educational background in a relevant field, for example, human rights law, social science, sustainable development or finance.
- At least five years of experience working in the field of business and human rights. Strong preference for individuals with experience engaging companies on human rights risks. Experience working on human rights in the ICT, financial or apparel sectors preferred; public policy advocacy experience a plus.
- Meaningful research and evaluation experience.
- Excellent written and oral communications skills.
- Experience and demonstrated success in organizing coalitions.
- Experience working with a wide range of diverse stakeholders, including civil society and affected rights-holders.
- Self-directed and able to manage tasks that meet deadlines.

Salary and Benefits
