








### Still failing on freedom of expression


- Improvements and some backsliding on internet shutdowns, overall disclosures still poor
- Blind spot: enforcement of rules (spam, harassment, illicit material)
- Blind spot: transparency
  around government
  censorship demands





## Wide gaps between HQ and subsidiaries

- Some policies apply across transnational companies, but many are country-specific
- Government contracts increase
  the disparities
- Adaptations by partner orgs are highlighting these problems





## **Companies responding to ESG pressure**

2022 is the first year every ranked telco published an ESG report.

The GSMA's first ever "<u>ESG Metrics for</u> <u>Mobile</u>" identify the RDR Index/Scorecards as the key source of digital rights KPIs.

Responsible investment reports show impact of engagement initiative coordinated by IAHR.
