

BP'S OIL AND GAS PROJECTS IN AZERBAIJAN

- Since 2020, BP and its project partners transferred \$35 billion-worth of oil and gas production more than four-times Azerbaijan's military spending during this period.
- "BP's long-standing partnership with the Aliyev 'dictatorship' has funded Azerbaijan's militarization and aggression against Armenia. BP has been happy to keep drilling, having learned nothing from the historic mistake it made in Russia. Funding violent dictatorship is always a bad strategy." Dominic Eagleton, Global Witness

BHRRC LETTER TO BP (SEPT. 19, 2023):

- "I. Has bp conducted material, legal and/or reputational risk assessments of doing business in Azerbaijan? If so, what were the results? It not, does it intend to?
- 2. Since bp is operating in a conflict-affected area, how is it enhancing its due diligence to identify, prevent and mitigate heightened human rights risks and comply with international humanitarian law?
 - a. What measures is bp taking to ensure it relies and acts upon robust monitoring of the situation, including through consultation with workers, affected communities, human rights groups, and/or humanitarian organisations?
 - b. What steps has bp taken or is planning to take to mitigate the heightened risk of contributing or being directly linked to the impacts of the ongoing conflict unfolding in the Nagorno-Karabakh area and of the blockade, and exacerbating the situation?
- 3.As the Nagorno-Karabakh crisis and the Lachin corridor blockade unfold, does bp intend to use its leverage to ensure the corridor remains open and ensure the rights of the 120,000 affected by the blockade are respected?"

BP RESPONSE (SEPT. 29, 2023):

- "bp's principal operations in Azerbaijan are over 400 km from the conflict-affected area.
 Together with our local partners, we are planning the development of a solar plant in the Jabrayil district, around 100km from the area. This district has not had a civilian population since the early 1990s."
- "It is bp's policy to conduct environmental and social impact assessments (including human rights aspects) for such projects."

BP'S RESPONSIBILITY AND RESPONSE

- Knowledge of human rights responsibility
- Knowledge of conflict and repression in Azerbaijan
- No evidence of heightened HRDD, use of leverage

IMPLICATIONS FOR INVESTORS

- Potential sanctions
- Potential litigation
- Instability
- Worsening repression threatens ability to conduct HRDD (see, for example: <u>Freedom House</u>, <u>Reporters Without Borders</u>)
- Reputational risk heighted by COP29
